The 54th Annual Clinical Hypnosis Course Offering Fundamental & Intermediate Training in Clinical Hypnosis

These courses span three days and provide twenty one hours of instruction. Course content is consistent with the American Society of Clinical Hypnosis basic & intermediate training guidelines. The courses provide a firm basis for the safe, ethical and effective use of hypnosis in clinical practice. Supervised practice sessions with faculty from a range of disciplines are used to help participants develop and refine hypnotherapeutic skills

Course Participants: Interdisciplinary Licensed Health and Mental Health care providers with graduate degrees. (dentists, physicians, nurses, psychologists, LCSW, LMFT, LPC, physical therapists, etc.) Interns, residents, masters' degree and doctoral students in the above professions are also eligible to participate. Completion of fundamental hypnosis training is necessary to register for the intermediate course.
